Professionalisation of the Heritage Sector

Presentation to APHP AGM

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Professionalisation process prior to 2022 AGM

- In November 2021, APHP started the process of applying to the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA) for the registration of the designation of Professional Heritage Practitioner (PHP).
- Five ExCo members attended a SAQA 'Professional Body Information Session' on 30 November 2021.
- On 3 March 2022, APHP sent letters to SAHRA, all PHRAs, and heritage-based University Departments.
- The SAQA process requires APHP to consult widely, & comments received from a PHRA were addressed in a Zoom meeting.

Outcome of APHP AGM 25 May 2022

Of the two routes to professionalisation, ** members adopted option 1: 1) through EAPASA to SAQA 2) APHP to SAQA direct. Members also adopted the SAQA application, and: - Annexure 1: Core Competencies - Annexure 2: Continuing Professional Development - Annexure 3: Recognition of Prior Learning (Annexures attached to this presentation).

Update on Professionalisation Process

- The application was submitted to EAPASA on 1 July 2022, who then forwarded it to SAQA, to register PHP as a <u>non-statutory</u> <u>designation</u>. APHP is too small to be a stand-alone Professional Body.
- The SAQA Board has not reached a decision.
- ExCo has prepared a draft MoA to govern the future relationship with EAPASA acting as the professional body registering practitioners against the PHP designation.
- ExCo sees the future of APHP as a Voluntary Association representing PHPs, organising seminars, exhibitions and conferences, and playing some role in the developing heritage discourse.

Recent developments with EAPASA

- EAPASA has joined the Council for the Built Environment (CBE), the umbrella body hosting several built environment professional bodies.
- On 11 January 2023, APHP ExCo supported the Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment in her gazetted intention to extend the appointment of EAPASA from 7 February 2023 until 7 February 2024.
- Minister Creecy re-appointed EAPASA for just 1 year on 7 February 2023.



Recent developments with SAHRA

- EAPASA has drawn SAHRA into the heritage professionalisation process.
- On 17 March 2023, SAHRA informed APHP they are drafting the "required legal framework with regards to registration [of heritage practitioners] in terms of section 38(2) of the NHRA" – a statutory basis for PHP registration by SAQA.
- As the party that initiated the heritage professionalisation process, APHP have welcomed SAHRA's involvement and expressed a willingness to engage with SAHRA in a co-operative spirit.
- SAHRA have requested a future meeting with APHP to discuss questions relating to some of the criteria in the PHP Core Competencies, CPD and RPL requirements (in Annexures overleaf)

CORE COMPETENCIES FOR THE DESIGNATION PROFESSIONAL HERITAGE PRACTITIONER





Core Competencies (CCs)

- Core Competency 1: Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the theoretical underpinnings of heritage practice.
- Core Competency 2: Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the South African legal & administrative context to discern what is relevant to decision-making.
- Core Competency 3: Demonstrate knowledge of heritage informants and the ability to conduct/commission historical research and consult with heritage claimants/authorities.
- Core Competency 4: Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of heritage qualities and the ability to determine heritage significance.
- Core Competency 5: Demonstrate the ability to analyse and interpret site and context.
- Core Competency 6: Demonstrate understanding and application of ethics of practice and behaviour.

ANNEXURE 3

DRAFT POLICY ON RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING FOR THE DESIGNATION PROFESSIONAL HERITAGE PRACTITIONER







Recognition of Prior Learning Policy (RPL)

- The **absence** of either or both a formal academic qualification and formal specialist training may be **compensated by** application of the principles of Recognition of Prior Learning in the form of **at least seven (7) years of proven and relevant experience** that constitutes professional standing in the field of heritage conservation and heritage management in South Africa in the application of sections 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 48, 49 and 51 of the National Heritage Resources Act (NHRA), Act 25 of 1999, <u>related to one or more</u> of the <u>activities</u> listed below and overleaf:
- Conservation of the built environment
- Landscape and visual analysis
- Historical research including heritage related indigenous knowledge systems
 and archival research
- Site research, including measuring and excavating
- Heritage surveying / conservation studies of sites or regions

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Recognition of Prior Learning Policy, Continued:

... at least seven (7) years of experience, related to one or more of the activities listed below:

- Assessment of cultural significance in terms of legal parameters
- Development of heritage-related informants or design indicators
- Heritage impact assessment
- Construction and supervision of construction as it relates to heritage resources
- Design in a heritage sensitive context
- Regulating and drafting heritage related legislation
- Heritage resource management
- Other appropriate heritage-related activities.

Such **relevant experience** in lieu of a qualification and specialist training shall be deemed a satisfactory basis for the **award of the PHP Designation**.
